4. Consideration and ACTION to appoint one (1) member to the Brownsville Public Utilities Board.

Mayor Eddie Treviño, Jr., moved that **Mr. Al Villarreal** be appointed to the Brownsville Public Utilities Board, replacing Mr. Billy Bradford who had served an eight (8) year term. Although Mr. Bradford was not present, Mayor Eddie Treviño, Jr., expressed his thanks to Mr. Bradford for his dedicated service to the community.

5. Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING on PROTESTED Ordinance 235-2005-031 to rezone, from “Z” Area District classification to “F” Area District classification, for 33.395 acres out of Share 15 of Espiritu Santo Grant, near Alton Gloor Boulevard and Tandy Road. DENIED

6. Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING on PROTESTED Ordinance 235-2005-032 to rezone, from “Z” Area District classification to “F” Area District classification, for 26.76 acres out of Shares 12 and 15 of Espiritu Santo Grant, near Alton Gloor Boulevard and Tandy Road. DENIED

7. Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING on PROTESTED Ordinance 235-2005-034 to rezone, from “Z” Area District classification to “F” Area District classification, for 25.00 acres out of Share 15 of Espiritu Santo Grant, near Alton Gloor Boulevard and Tandy Road. DENIED.

Mr. Ariel Chavez, P.E., representing the developer, spoke in favor of the rezoning of the properties in question.

Mr. Jesse Quezada and Ms. Judy King expressed their opposition to rezoning of the properties in question.

Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo suggested denial of the rezoning request because the developer did not provide sufficient information to the residents.

Upon motion by Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros, seconded by Commissioner Ernie L. Hernandez and carried unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros moved that Protested Ordinance Numbers 235-2005-031, 235-2005-032; and 235-2005-034 be **DENIED**.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously.

31. Consideration and ACTION to award a contract for the construction of the Veterans Memorial Park.

Mr. Paul Calapa, Purchasing and Contracting Manager, noted that after the Evaluation Committee's review of the proposals received, Roth Construction, Inc. was selected as the highest ranked firm.

American Legion Commander Leal, longtime advocate for the construction of the Veterans Memorial Park, expressed his gratitude for the work being done to accomplish the construction of the park honoring American veterans.

Upon motion by Mayor Eddie Treviño, Jr., seconded by Commissioner David A. Betancourt, in honor of his late father the Honorable Judge Adolfo Betancourt, and carried unanimously, a contract was awarded to **Roth Construction, Inc. of Victoria, Texas**, in the amount of **\$1,029,000**, for the construction of the Veterans Memorial Park.

21. **ACTION to approve Ordinance Number 2005-1441 to authorize the issuance, sale and delivery of “City of Brownsville, Texas, General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2005”; to secure the payment thereof to authorize the levy of an annual ad valorem tax; to approve and authorize the execution of all instruments and procedures related thereto including a paying agent/registrars agreement, a bond purchasing agreement, and escrow agreement and an official statement; and delegating to the Mayor, City Manager, and the Finance Director the authority to approve all final terms of the bonds and to select the outstanding bonds to be refunded with proceeds of the bonds.**

Mr. Larry Jordan, representing Estrada & Hinojosa & Company, gave a Powerpoint presentation regarding the refunding bonds, noting a savings of 3.575%.

Mr. Tom Spurgeon, Legal Counsel, noted that the Ordinance would approve the final terms for the issuance of the General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series, 2005.

Upon motion by Commissioner Ernie L. Hernandez, seconded by Commissioner Sally M. Arroyo and carried unanimously, Ordinance Number 2005-1441, was **adopted**.

8. **Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING of Ordinance Number 2005-1427-B to adopt the Final Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan for the Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone Number 2 (TIRZ 2).** [TABLED 06/21/2005]

Mr. Ben Medina, Director of Planning and Community Development, reviewed the Financing Plan for the TIRZ 2 (University Park) and noted that the plan sets forth categories of eligible improvements for the property. Taxing entities participating in the TIRZ 2 would be the Brownsville Navigation District, Cameron County, and the City of Brownsville.

Upon motion by Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros, seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros moved that Ordinance Number 2005-1427-B be **adopted** on first reading for a 15-year reinvestment financial plan.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously.

Mayor Eddie Treviño, Jr., stepped out. Mayor Pro-Tem, Carlos A. Cisneros, presided.

9. Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING on Ordinance 235-2005-026 to rezone, from “Z” Area District classification to “F” Area District classification, for Block 9 of Olmito Tract Number 1 of Shares 12 and 15 of Espiritu Santo Grant, near Lomax Road and FM 803.

Upon motion by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and seconded unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., moved that Ordinance Number 235-2005-026 be **adopted** on first reading.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sally M. Arroyo and carried unanimously.

10. Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING on Ordinance 235-2005-039 to rezone, from Dwelling “Z” classification to Medium Retail “G” classification, for Lots 4 thru 6 and Lot 7 of Block 104 of Olmito Original Townsite, located 7575 North Expressway 77/83.

Upon motion by Commissioner Ernie L. Hernandez, seconded by Commissioner Sally M. Arroyo and carried unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner Sally M. Arroyo moved that Ordinance Number 235-2005-039 be **adopted** on first reading.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously.

11. Public Hearing and ACTION to approve a substantial amendment to the City’s One-Year Action Plan of the 30th Year HUD Entitlement Grants Fiscal Year 2004-2005.

Mr. Ben Medina, Director of Planning and Community Development, noted that the amendments to the Action Plan included Multi-family housing units, Street repaving, Town North drainage, and Bus pad construction.

Upon motion by Commissioner David A. Betancourt, seconded by Commissioner Ernie L. Hernandez and carried unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner David A. Betancourt moved that a substantial amendment to the City's One-Year Action Plan be **approved**, for the 30th Year HUD Entitlement Grants Fiscal Year 2004-2005.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ernie L. Hernandez and carried unanimously.

Mayor Eddie Treviño, Jr., returned.

Mayor Pro-tem, Carlos A. Cisneros, stepped out.

12. Public Hearing and ACTION on Resolution Number 2005-027 to authorize the application to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Recreation Grants Branch Outdoor Recreation Grant Program.

Dr. Delina Barrera, Brownsville Community Improvements Corporation Executive Director, noted that the application would request additional funds for construction of additional amenities, within the Brownsville Sports Park, that are not available in our community.

Upon motion by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., seconded by Commissioner David A. Betancourt and carried unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., moved that Resolution Number 2005-027 be **approved** to authorize the application to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Recreation Grants Branch Outdoor Recreation Grant Program.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sally M. Arroyo and carried unanimously.

Mr. David Garcia, representing the Veterans International Bridge System at Los Tomates, presented the 2005 Third Quarterly report.

Upon motion by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., seconded by Commissioner David A. Betancourt and carried unanimously, the 2005 Third Quarterly Report for the Veterans International Bridge System at Los Tomates, was **acknowledged.**

Commissioner Sally M. Arroyo stepped out.

Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros returned.

Upon motion by Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros, seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously, the South Texas Auto Theft Enforcement Task Force Equipment Supplement Grant Award was **authorized** for acceptance in the amount of **\$19,668.00**.

- 23. ACTION on Resolution Number 2005-026 to authorize the City Manager to accept a Grant Award, in the amount of \$900,000 from the Texas Automobile Theft Prevention Authority for the project South Texas Auto Theft Enforcement Task Force.**

Upon motion by Commissioner David A. Betancourt, seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously, Resolution Number 2005-026 was **adopted** to authorize the City Manager to accept a Grant Award, in the amount of \$900,000, of which the Brownsville Police Department's share amount would be \$480,000, from the Texas Automobile Theft Prevention Authority for the project South Texas Auto Theft Enforcement Task Force.


