**6. Consideration and ACTION to appoint one (1) member to the Brownsville Beautification Committee.**

Mayor Pat M. Ahumada, Jr., moved that Dr. Sandra Garcia be appointed to the Brownsville Beautification Committee. The motion failed due to lack of a second.

Upon motion by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., seconded by Commissioner Leonel T. Garza and carried unanimously, **Mr. Carlos Ayala** was appointed to the Brownsville Beautification Committee.

**7. Consideration and ACTION on removal of one or more members of the Brownsville Citizens Advisory Committee (BCAC) and appointments to fill vacancies. (TABLED)**

Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo noted that Ms. Minnie Garza had resigned and that he would like to appoint Ms. Berta Alonso. Upon determining that a Public Service Application was not presented prior to meeting time, Commissioner Camarillo moved to withdraw his motion. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr. and carried unanimously.

Upon motion by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo, seconded by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., and carried unanimously, action on Ms. Alonso's appointment was **tabled** until the next regular meeting of the Commission.

Commissioner Leonel T. Garza moved that Rev. Jerry Frank be removed from the Brownsville Citizens Advisory Committee. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., but no vote was taken.

After lengthy discussion, regarding Commissioners' concerns, Commissioner Anthony P. Troiani moved that the item be **tabled** and that Commissioners meet with Rev. Jerry Frank to discuss their concerns. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros and carried unanimously.

**8. Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING of Ordinance Number 2008-1488 to authorize the closure of a portion of Old Alice Road located north of Emilia Lane.**

Mr. Ben Medina, Director of Planning and Community Development, noted that the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the ordinance.

Upon motion by Commissioner Charlie Atkinson, seconded by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., and carried unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner Charlie Atkinson moved that Ordinance Number 2008-01488 be **adopted** on first reading to authorize the closure of a portion of Old Alice Road located north of Emilia Lane. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., and carried unanimously.

**9. Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING of Ordinance Number 235-2008-016 to rezone, from Dwelling "G" to General Retail "G" (4CG) Classification, 17.605 acres out of Share 12 of Espiritu Santo Grant located near FM 511 and Baker Road.**

Mr. Ben Medina, Director of Planning and Community Development, noted that the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the ordinance.

Upon motion by Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros, seconded by Commissioner Leonel T. Garza and carried unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros moved that Ordinance Number 235-2008-016 be **adopted** on first reading, to authorize the closure of a portion of Old Alice Road located north of Emilia Lane. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously.

**10. Public Hearing and ACTION on FIRST READING of Ordinance Number 235-2008-017-S to allow a Medium Commercial Specific Use (car wash, 6C) in a General Retail “G” (4CG) area of Lot 30 Block 7 of Rose Garden Subdivision located at 4015 Old Highway 77, Brownsville, Texas 78521.**

Mr. Ben Medina, Director of Planning and Community Development, noted that the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the ordinance.

Upon motion by Commissioner Leonel T. Garza, seconded by Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros and carried unanimously, the public hearing was **closed**.

Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo moved that Ordinance Number 235-2008-017-S be **adopted** on first reading, to allow a Medium Commercial Specific Use (car wash.) 6-C in a General Retail “G” (4CG) area of Lot 30, Block 7 of Rose Garden Subdivision located at 4015 Old Highway 77, Brownsville, Texas. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Leonel T. Garza and carried unanimously.

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***ACTION ITEMS:***

**11. Consideration and ACTION regarding the City of Brownsville’s holidays’ schedule.**

Mr. Charlie Cabler, City Manager, presented the proposed amended holiday schedule for the City of Brownsville, noting that the proposed holiday schedule would match the Brownsville Public Utilities Board schedule. He further noted that the Christmas Day holiday would include Christmas Eve.

Upon motion by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo, seconded by Commissioner Anthony P. Troiani and carried unanimously, the City of Brownsville’s holiday schedule was **approved** as presented.

**12. Consideration and ACTION on Resolution Number 2008-035 authorizing the renaming of Brownsville Road to Sports Park Boulevard.**

Dr. Delina Barrera, Executive Director of the Brownsville Community Improvement Corporation (BCIC) presented the resolution.

Upon motion by Commissioner Charlie Atkinson, seconded by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., and carried unanimously, Resolution Number 2008-035 was **approved** as presented, to authorize the renaming of Brownsville Road to “Sports Park Boulevard”.

**13. Consideration and ACTION on Resolution Number 2008-039 authorizing the Brownsville Community Improvement Corporation (BCIC) to borrow from the City of Brownsville approximately \$3.2 million and providing for repayment and dealing with related matters.**

Mr. Pete Gonzalez, Finance Director, noted that, should the loan be authorized, BCIC would repay the loan over a ten-year period.

Upon motion by Commissioner Charlie Atkinson, seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously, Resolution Number 2008-039 was **approved**, authorizing the Brownsville Community Improvement Corporation to borrow from the City of Brownsville approximately \$3.2 million and provide for repayment.

**14. Consideration and ACTION on Resolution Number 2008-038 expressing official intention to reimburse with tax-exempt obligation proceeds for costs incurred to acquire land adjacent to the Sports Park.**

Upon motion by Commissioner Charlie Atkinson, seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously, Resolution Number 2008-038 was **approved**, expressing official intent to reimburse with tax exempt obligation proceeds for costs incurred to acquire land adjacent to the Sports Park.

***PURCHASES/BIDS/CONTRACTS:***

- 15. Consideration and ACTION to adopt an Inter-local Agreement between the City of Brownsville and the Brownsville Community Improvement Corporation (BCIC) whereby the BCIC agrees to pay all of the debt service requirements resulting from an approximate \$3.2 million certificates of obligation to be issued by the City for the BCIC.**

Commissioner Charlie Atkinson moved that an Inter-Local Agreement between the City of Brownsville and the Brownsville Community Improvement Corporation be **adopted**, whereby the BCIC agrees to pay all of the debt service requirements resulting from an approximate \$3.2 million in certificates of obligation to be issued by the City for the BCIC.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Leonel T. Garza and carried unanimously.

- 16. Consideration and ACTION to authorize the City Manager to execute the Brownsville Sports Park Joint Maintenance Agreement with the Brownsville Community Improvement Corporation (BCIC) for Fiscal Year 2008.**

Upon motion by Commissioner Charlie Atkinson, seconded by Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo and carried unanimously, the City Manager was **authorized** to execute the Brownsville Sports Park Joint Maintenance Agreement with the Brownsville Community Improvement Corporation for Fiscal Year 2008.

- 17. Consideration and ACTION to authorize the Brownsville Fire Department to accept a grant for the amount of \$15,000 from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) for the purchase of EMS equipment.**

Upon motion by Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros, seconded by Commissioner Charlie Atkinson and carried unanimously, the Brownsville Fire Department was **authorized** to accept a grant, in the amount of **\$15,000**, from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) for the purchase of EMS equipment.

**18. Consideration and ACTION to authorize the acceptance and expenditure of the Governor's Division of Emergency Management (GDEM) Fiscal Year 2007 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) awarded to the Brownsville Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security in the amount of \$210,215.47.**

Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros moved that the Brownsville Office of Emergency Management be **authorized** to accept and expend the Governor's Division of Emergency Management (GDEM) Fiscal Year 2007 Homeland Security Grant Program award, in the amount of **\$210,215.47**. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anthony P. Troiani and carried by the following vote:

Commissioner Charlie Atkinson had stepped out and did not vote.

**19. Consideration and ACTION to authorize the acceptance of a Service Agreement between the Cameron County Emergency Communications District (CCECD) and the City of Brownsville regarding the provision of certain dispatcher training in connection with the operation of CCECD's Emergency Telephone Number Service (ETNS).**

Commissioner Leonel T. Garza moved that a Service Agreement, between the Cameron County Emergency Communications District (CCECD) and the City of Brownsville be **authorized** for acceptance, for the provision of certain dispatcher training in connection with the operation of CCECD's Emergency Telephone Number Service (ETNS). The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anthony P. Troiani and carried unanimously.

**20. Consideration and ACTION to authorize the acceptance and execution of a Local Border Security Program (Border Star) Grant awarded to the Brownsville Police Department, in the amount of \$95,291.76 from February 15 – August 15, 2008.**

Commissioner Anthony P. Troiani moved that the Brownsville Police Department be **authorized** to accept and execute a Local Border Security Program (*Border Star*) Grant, in the amount of **\$95,291.76**, from February 15 through August 15, 2008. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Carlos A. Cisneros and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Mayor Ahumada, Commissioners Troiani, Longoria, Cisneros, and Camarillo;

Nayes: None;

Abstention: Commissioner Atkinson.

Commissioner Leonel T. Garza had stepped out and did not vote.

**21. Consideration and ACTION to award a contract for parking lot improvements at the Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport.**

Mr. Roberto Luna, Interim Purchasing Director, noted that the recommended bidder's estimate was lower than the Engineer's estimate by \$152,884.50.

Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr, moved that a contract, in the amount of **\$639,340.50**, including all alternates, be awarded to **R & R Paving, of San Benito, Texas**, for parking lot improvements at the Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anthony P. Troiani and carried unanimously.

**22. Consideration and ACTION to award a term contract for the purchase and delivery of uniforms for the Brownsville Urban System (BUS) Department.**

Commissioner Charlie Atkinson moved that a term contract, in the amount of **\$18,120.00**, be awarded to **Uniforms, Inc. of Dallas, Texas**, for the purchase and delivery of uniforms for the Brownsville Urban System (BUS) Department.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anthony P. Troiani and carried unanimously.

**23. Consideration and ACTION to authorize an amendment to the 2006 CIP Project Contract Number 1 for street paving and drainage improvements for Laredo Road and Grey Fox Circle.**

Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo moved that an amendment to the 2006 CIP Project Contract Number 1, in the amount of **\$83,799.00**, be authorized to **G&T Paving Company, of Brownsville, Texas**, for street paving and drainage improvements for Laredo Road and Grey Fox Circle.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., and carried unanimously.

**24. Consideration and ACTION to award a contract for traffic signal improvements at Central Boulevard and Media Luna Drive.**

Commissioner Edward C. Camarillo moved that a contract, in the amount of **\$100,725.20**, be awarded to **Star Operation of Corpus Christi, Texas**, for traffic signal improvements at Central Boulevard and Media Luna Drive.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ricardo Longoria, Jr., and carried unanimously.
